Asian American Government Executives Network - AAGEN

The Asian American Government Executives Network (AAGEN) works to promote diversity in government by supporting and mentoring government leaders who are from diverse backgrounds. Due to the extremely low number of employees in senior government positions from diverse backgrounds, it is more important than ever to increase the government leadership to better represent the United States demographics. For example, according to the Congressional Research Service, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders only make up about 3.3% of the current congressional membership.

AAGEN was established in 1993 through the devoted work of just a few Asian American executives working within the federal government who created a network of Asian and Pacific Islander executives to create opportunities for Asian Americans as well as to diversify leadership in the workforce. Years later, AAGEN has impacted the diversity of government workforce in all facets and levels of the government.

In October of 2005, AAGEN held their first leadership conference, a day long training session structured to

assist high potential government leaders and executives in strengthening and building their federal careers. Embodying the values and mission of AAGEN, the annual conferences allow leaders to hone their management and leadership skills while also offering one-on-one mentoring and coaching. This mentoring, along with the Senior Executive Service (SES) development program, truly allow individuals to gain the skills and motivation necessary to become a strong leader in the federal workforce. The importance of AAGEN and its various workshops cannot be understated. Not only does the work of AAGEN benefit the lives of Asian and Pacific Islander government executives, it expands the federal workforce to represent and include a more diverse group of leaders. From its SESDP program, it has the best success rate for producing diverse senior executives.
